Dear Public Water System Owner:

Enclosed you will find a copy of your water system's **2011 Contaminant Monitoring Schedule**. After reviewing this schedule, post it in a visible location to remind yourself of when to sample. Monitoring schedules are also located at <http://www.epa.ohio.gov/ddagw/schedules.aspx>. This web page will be updated monthly as revised schedules are mailed.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS ABOUT DRINKING WATER SAMPLING

Routine total coliform monitoring requirements are listed on the monitoring schedules. Total coliform positive samples will increase your total coliform monitoring requirements beyond what is listed on the enclosed schedule. Monitoring will temporarily increase to include at least 4 repeat samples to be taken immediately and 5 routine samples the month following a positive total coliform sample. You may be required to take additional samples for the ground water rule.

Information for the ground water rule requirements is listed on the monitoring schedules. If your schedule notes your system as having substantial treatment, you will be required to take additional samples if any routine total coliform samples are positive.

Collect samples early during scheduled time periods. It is recommended that samples are collected early in the scheduled monitoring period to ensure timely reporting. Samples collected before or after the scheduled monitoring period(s) will not meet your compliance requirements.

Give the laboratory complete information needed for correct reporting. Much of this information is listed on the enclosed monitoring schedule. If this information is not provided to your laboratory, your water system may have problems in meeting the monitoring and reporting requirements. A list of certified laboratories is included.

Identify the location where the sample is collected, the sample monitoring point (SMP) for this location, and the State Facility ID when you submit your samples to the laboratory. Nitrate and nitrite samples should be collected at the entry point (first available tap AFTER ANY TREATMENT) and marked with the EP00# and State Facility ID listed on your schedule. Total coliform samples should be collected at taps in your system and the tap location information should be provided to the laboratory. The State Facility ID for your total coliform samples is DS1.

Please note that your schedule may be revised based on the monitoring results for your system.

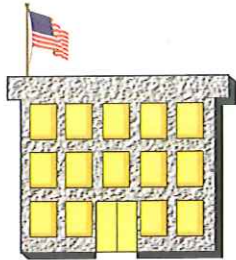

IT'S THE LAW!

Federal law requires contractors that disturb painted surfaces in homes, child care facilities and schools, built before 1978 to be certified and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination. Always ask to see your contractor's certification.

Federal law requires that individuals receive certain information before renovating more than six square feet of painted surfaces in a room for interior projects or more than twenty square feet of painted surfaces for exterior projects or window replacement or demolition in housing, child care facilities and schools built before 1978.

- Homeowners and tenants: renovators must give you this pamphlet before starting work.
- Child care facilities, including preschools and kindergarten classrooms, and the families of children under six years of age that attend those facilities: renovators must provide a copy of this pamphlet to child care facilities and general renovation information to families whose children attend those facilities.
